Despite the heat, it's really starting to seem like Fall. The days have more of that Fall Feel. The light is a bit lower, the trees are coloring up, and the days

are definitely shorter. I am having a hard time believing that I need to put on a headlamp in order to see during the evening feeding!

And speaking of earlier darkness, we've been treated to a lovely celestial show the past couple of days as the Moon, Jupiter and Saturn converge. Tonight will be the last of this <u>three-day astronomical event</u>. Hopefully our clear skies will continue for this!

As much as we want to enjoy this lovely warm weather, we know that it won't last forever. Thursday was a delightful 81 degrees! However, this weekend and next week will bring lows in the 40s and mid-30s! We are trying to get preparations made for winter so that we can be ahead of the curve.

A great thing about our new Pump House (aka Sheep Shack) is that we will have our wellhead protected from freezing temperatures. In the past we have had to cover the well with pallets, old styrofoam plant trays and tarps along with a heat lamp to keep things from freezing. This usually got installed the afternoon of the predicted freeze. Now with this insulated building, aside from needing to add a heat lamp, everything should be just fine. We did want to get a protective coat of stain on the building before winter so Master Painter Bob came to the rescue!





Another pre-winter maintenance task is to get the exterior of the walk-in pressure washed. The paint was flaking badly on our Army Surplus cooler and it was definitely time to get those flakes of paint as well as the accumulated mold and moss(!) off the exterior. Nothing that Bob and a pressure washer can't handle, huh? Next up: A new paint job!
