

## Happy Friday, Farm Friends!

What a beautiful week this has been! The leaves have been at their most glorious and the colors seem to be the most intense and long-lasting in recent memory. The deep oranges, reds, golds, and yellows are simply breathtaking. It's so pretty, it's almost distracting!



We've been able to enjoy the view of Cook's Wall this week as it stands guard over us as we plant garlic. It is decked out in its best colors. This field truly has the most spectacular view of any on the farm. I missed my opportunity to get the best shot with clear blue skies on Wednesday but this one isn't bad!



So yes, we are now deep in garlic planting mode. So far we have planted 9,408 cloves! That puts us more than two-thirds of the way to our goal of 14,000. We've planted most of the larger quantities of varieties -- Lorz Italian, Chesnok Red, Music and German Red. The conditions have been perfect -- the beds are deep and fluffy, and we can actually see the dibble marks which show us where to plant. Trust me when I say that this is NOT what we always experience!

Marking the beds with the rolling dibbler. We had this implement fabricated about 8 years ago and it has been a true game changer.

The dibbles (pieces of PVC pipe bolted into the expanded metal cylinder with long carriage bolts) are moveable so we can set up the spacing to meet the needs of the crops and field. This year, we are going with the most space we have ever used -- there are only two rows of garlic per bed. We are doing this set-up to let us cultivate the garlic with the Cub instead of doing all of the in-row weeding by hand. Here's hoping this will work!

Once the holes have been marked with the dibbler, it's time to lay out the garlic and plant!








## **Luna & Hoover's Great Adventures**
