Lots of changes happening around the farm. We wanted to fill you in on some of the things that we've got planned. Ray and I have been doing a lot of planning and thinking over the past several months. We're really tired and have decided to take a large portion of the farm land out of production and use it for development.

There is a shortage of housing in our area and we feel that if we build some multi-family units on the land that we can make a difference in the community and our bank account. These won't be huge high rises -- they will be 3-story apartment buildings that will face Flat Shoals Road.

We considered putting in a trailer park in the space but decided that we wanted something more permanent.

Just to get us started with some land prep, we had some grading done to smooth out some edges and we also removed a few trees.

We hope that if all goes well, the first families will be moving into their homes by 2024!

Greenhouse Progress!

Ray and Alex kept on getting posts in the ground for the greenhouse expansion. We needed 2 more posts since some of the original posts were bent when they were removed from the original location. This greenhouse was originally a 200' one located outside Pilot Mountain -- Ray disassembled it in 2008 and moved it to the farm.

So, Cheryl headed out to get the needed posts from Piedmont Fence. We got 2 from them last year and for about \$150. When Cheryl talked to them this week, the price was now \$484!!! Yikes!

We decided to hold off on getting the new pipe and considered our options. We could shorten the greenhouse -- which would reduce the size by 200 square

feet. Not a desirable option but it would save a lot of money. Or we could take the pipes to a machine shop to see if they could be straightened.

Ray had another idea -- what if we tried to straighten them with the tractor? At first, he and Alex put the pipe in the arms of the front-end loader and applied pressure to it by leaning on it. Nope -- didn't work.



So, then they tried using a stump as a leverage point to bend it while the tractor bucket was slowly moved. It worked!



Now that we had straight pipe, we could finish up the job of setting all the posts. Alex and Ray steadily worked through the task and got them installed on Wednesday evening. Thanks for hanging in on the project, Alex!



Good thing they finished when they did -- all the heavy rain we got on Thursday quickly filled in the postholes. It would have taken at least another week for them to dry out enough to finish the job.



Lots of other progress was being made this week --



Jonny and Sophie spread manure on the raspberry beds. This nutrientrich amendment will help our young plants kick-start their growth for the season.
