Taters and Garlic

The potatoes that we planted 3 weeks ago have really taken off. Lots of sprouts in the field -- and the weeds were trying to see if they could sprout faster! Never fear! The Cultivating Cub is Here! Ray hopped on his trusty (rusty?) steed and went in search of those rascally weeds. Take that, mean ol' bermuda grass and sedge!







We've also been making sure that the garlic is getting adequate water during this dry spell. Garlic is now beginning the process of bulbing up and needs moisture. Here's an average-sized Chesnok. Not bad for the beginning of May! We'll be harvesting in mid-June so it still has a lot of growing to do.



Chesnok typically has far more slender stems -- so we are REALLY excited about this!

Let's Learn Something! Brambles and Ginger Workshops

Lots of folks have purchased blackberry, raspberry and ginger plants from us this year (and previously!) -- thank you! If you want to make sure that you have success with your plants and get the most out of them, we have 2 upcoming workshops that are just the ticket.

The first one is focused on brambles -- blackberries, raspberries and black raspberries. "Growing the Jewels of the Garden" is a 2-part workshop. The first one is on **Sunday, May 15 from 2-4:30**. It will focus on the different types of cane fruits as well as the planting, trellising and tending of blackberries and raspberries in the spring and summer. The second session (late summer/early fall date TBD) will help you get your brambles ready for winter and a successful spring. The workshops will be hands-on and will give you the confidence you need to have success with these wonderful fruits. You do not need to participate in both workshops but there is a discount if you do. The cost for both sessions is \$50; the cost for a single session is \$35. Click here to register.
