Happy Friday, Farm Friends!



It's a Tsunami of Peas! We are swimming in peas (and lots of rain!) this week! We've gotten well over 400 pounds of these delicious pods -- and this is just the first round of them. A second planting will probably start producing in about 3 weeks.

And we want to share this delicious bounty with you! You can't find local

In addition to both Sugar Snap and Snow Peas, you'll find Garlic Scapes and your last opportunity to get one of our Strawberry Hanging Baskets. We look forward to packing up an order for you today!

We haven't totally been pea-brained this week. Other things happened too! We planted pecks of Pepper plants! Sophie and Elise slogged through the mud and got our Shishitos, Chile and other hot peppers planted this week. We haven't had peppers in this field in a very long time so it will be interesting to see how it produces. We plant our hot and specialty peppers (Shishito and Aji Dulce) in the field and the sweet peppers go into a high tunnel. Our experience has shown that we get better results in sweet peppers when they are grown under cover (better ripening and less sunburn).



The peppers are next door to the potatoes, which are growing like crazy and look great! Unfortunately, the Colorado Potato Beetles (CPB) think they look great, too. The beetles have moved in quickly and have exceeded our ability to manage them by hand-picking the insects, so we will have to use an organic pesticide to control them. We have found that Spinosad, which comes from a naturally occurring soil bacterium, is a very effective treatment for

CPB. Typically, one application of the product knocks down the adult beetles and larvae to a tolerable level. This pest is definitely one to act on quickly -they can completely defoliate a field in a matter of days. No leaves, no potatoes -- simple as that!



Workshop Success!

We had a lot of fun with our Ginger Workshop attendees on Sunday! Ray walked folks through the basics of growing ginger and turmeric at home and shared the tips we've learned over the years of growing this crop. Participants got to plant both ginger and turmeric rhizomes to take home and learned about what to expect over the course of the plants' l-o-n-g growth period.
