There are 3 on the north side of the house that are huge, but their branches are beginning to break. On Monday morning we awoke to a large branch that had broken over the sheep paddock -- no one was hurt, thankfully!

## Field Walk Time!

Let's take a look around the farm and see what's been going on, shall we?

We're getting the strawberry field ready for planting next month. Unfortunately, more than half of the existing strawberries didn't survive. We have plants coming in October but only about 900 -- so we are going to be shy of the plants that we need to fill the field for next year's crop. The pressure's on to tend each one of them well so they will produce a bumper crop for 2023!





Hay Daze! Now that the rain has stopped for a bit, it's time to do the Hay Hustle. Making hay is one of the most nerve-wracking parts of our operation. Trying to get the timing right is so tough. And for the fall cutting it is even more difficult because you need even more time for it to dry since it is cooler. Barring equipment issues, we hope to get it in the barn by next week (fingers and toes crossed!) More plants in the ground! We have whittled our planting list down and only have a few more things to get planted. A bit behind schedule but it's getting done!

The cabbage loopers and armyworms got the memo about all the new plants. Aargh! Time to get with the plan for using Bt or <u>Bacillus</u> <u>thuringiensis v. kurstaki</u>. It's a beneficial bacteria that will infect the unwelcome diners. It will control most *Lepidopteran* (caterpillar) insects such as cabbage loopers and armyworms without harming other insects. We use organic pesticides very sparingly and when we do, we want one that's as specific as possible to our target pest.
