Something new! We are now experimenting with growing mushrooms for our *PlumFresh* members. What's so exciting is that our friends at <u>Borrowed Land Farm</u> are producing fruiting blocks AND they are now Certified Organic! This means that we are the only market farm producing Organic mushrooms in the area! How cool is that?

Our high tunnel tomatoes are still producing! The ones in the field are goners but we are still getting pretty good harvests in the tunnel. It will be pretty sweet having tomatoes in November.

We've had the pleasure of partnering with Dr. Gouchen Yang and his team from NC A & T University on their ginger tissue culture research. A couple of

weeks ago, his researchers came to the farm to gather measurements on the height of our ginger plants, the number of stems per plant and their caliper, as well as data on the greenhouse. They are comparing our site with what they have growing at the A & T Farm.



This week, William came back to get some additional light readings to measure how much sunlight is getting to the plants in our greenhouse.



It's such a wonderful opportunity to be a part of this research. We learn so much from Dr. Yang and his team. It's great to feel like we are able to contribute in a small way to bringing this amazing crop to more small farmers!
