Greenhouse Expansion Update!

I know we seem to have a one-track mind lately, but this is a major project and is consuming a lot of our time. Much of the work this week has focused on getting the greenhouse floor ready. First up: a few bits of rock dust (36 tons!)



Two trucks later, we were ready to start spreading out all this material to create a smooth surface that will drain. Greenhouses are very wet environments, and it is very important to have a good, level, well-draining floor for the structure. Now that we have 12 years experience with one, we have a pretty good clue about what works!

Spreading this vast amount of material was not a simple task especially since it was done by hand. Making sure that the surface was perfectly level was essential. Ray would dump the rock dust with the tractor bucket, and we would spread it out to make sure that it met the line levels along the sides of the building. Suffice it to say that we all got a pretty good workout! Shovels, rakes and a concrete filled roller were the main tools of the day.









After we got the rock dust spread, leveled, and packed it was time to cover the surface with landscape fabric. Again, this was a precise operation. But we were able to get 30 feet of fabric installed before we had to prepare for an inch of rain. :- (







With today's sunny weather, we'll be able to get the rest of the greenhouse floor completed in no time!
