We have to start out with a HUGE thank you to all of you wonderful folks who came out to our Summer Plant Sale last weekend! You blew us away with your interest in our tons of tomatoes, the plethora of peppers and the snazzy strawberry baskets! We are so grateful for your support of our small, Organic farm. Hundreds of plants went off to new homes!

And we had so much fun with that sale that we are doing it again! Since many of our plants weren't quite ready to put out for sale last week, we decided to expand our **2nd Chance Summer Plant Sale** to TWO days. The weather forecast is looking good for planting -- after May 6, the projected lows are only in the mid-50s. Good news tomato fans!

**Crop Report** 

It hasn't all been plant sales here at Plum Granny Farm (although at times it has felt like it!). We've been getting other things done as well -- like actually tending crops and prepping fields! The potatoes we planted back at the end of March are looking really good. Ray has been able to cultivate them a couple of times and got them hilled before yesterday's rain. Timing is everything!





And tomatoes are looking mighty fine, too! Ray got all of the grafted and nongrafted slicers planted in Ajo on Monday. Just a few -- 276. See the little clip on the tomato? That's the junction of the graft!



And the tomatoes in Raz House that were planted in March are beginning to set fruit! We are hoping for 'maters by the end of May.



We take pollination very seriously here at the farm. If our fruiting plants aren't adequately pollinated, we get poor production as well as misshapen fruit. <u>Sometimes we have to bring in helpers</u> to ensure that every flower gets the pollen it needs!

## Let's Learn Something! Brambles Workshop

Lots of folks have purchased blackberry and raspberry plants from us this year (and previously!) -- thank you! If you want to make sure that you have success with your plants and get the most out of them, we have a workshop that is just the ticket.

Our brambles workshop is a very popular session that has given attendees the tools and confidence to grow great berries. "Growing the Jewels of the Garden" is a 2-part workshop. The first part is **Sunday, May 7 from 1-4 p.m.** It will focus on the different types of cane fruits as well as the planting, trellising and tending of blackberries and raspberries in the spring and summer. The second session (October date TBD) will help you get your brambles ready for winter and a successful spring. The workshops are hands-on and will give you what you need to have success with these wonderful fruits. You do not need to participate in both sessions but there is a discount if you do.
