Busy week here on the farm as we have been working to get the place back in shape! It's RESET Time!

We are starting our <u>PlumFresh Harvest Subscription</u> program this week. Our first deliveries are Saturday at Cobblestone Farmers Market, Clemmons and here at the farm. It's always exciting to get ready for those first deliveries -- it's somewhat like the first day of school. You try to remember where you put your backpack, notebooks and pencils...

This year it's a bit more crazed because we had completely torn up our packing area at the Tobacco Barn in the process of building the walk-in cooler. That, plus the normal winterizing things we did (disconnect all of the PVC plumbing and other things that could freeze), meant that the area was in complete chaos!

Inside the Tobacco Barn was in no better shape. It's always so easy to toss things into storage when that storage area isn't being used daily, right? That

described the Tobacco Barn completely.

It was time for a reset.

First, we had to haul everything out of the barn. It looked like a highly disorganized yard sale!





Next up was to clear all of the shelves and work on the floor. We've been wanting to put landscape fabric on the floor for several years, so now was as good a time as any. The dirt floor was always a problem because no matter how hard we tried, there was always dust and if rain came in, we had mud. Not the ideal situation. So, with some quick work, Jonny, Elise and Ray got the flooring down and then everything was put back in order! Nice!

So while we were at this cleaning thing, it was time to wash up a winter's worth of dishes -- HUNDREDS of seed trays, crates, totes, buskets and more! Everyone had shriveled hands and wet feet by the end of this day. But we had lots of fresh, clean containers and seed trays all ready to go!





And how about cleaning up some fields as well? The garlic was due for a weeding -- there were some monster chunks in the aisles! A couple of tarploads later, the weeds were out of the way of the garlic which is starting its bulbing and bulking up process now (it's looking really good, by the way!)







And it was time to find homes for the plants left over from the plant sales. We've donated plants to the community garden in Walnut Cove which is coordinated by the Girl Scouts, to <a href="https://docs.pythology.com/Threshold-Farm">Threshold Farm</a> to support their efforts to feed those in need, as well as to the Forsyth County Community Gardens program to provide plants to neighborhoods that are in food deserts. ## Turmeric at Home!




