Happy Friday, Farm Friends!



What a lovely view out of my office window today. That's one of the great things about working outside -- you get to pick your view so much of the time! WFH is one thing, but WFF (Work From Farm) is something entirely different!

We had better enjoy the sunshine over the next couple of days because it's looking like a rainy one next week.

A lot of this week has been spent on getting the sweet potato field ready for planting. The field is fertilized, beds are shaped and prepped, and drip

irrigation is all tucked in. Now all we need is to pop in the sweet potato slips, right? Not so fast!



Planting sweet potatoes is like sending an engraved invitation to an *All You Can Eat* buffet for deer. Sweet potato plants are absolute deer candy. Before we plant, we <u>must</u> fence!

So that's what we are doing. Jonny, Camile and Ray have spent the better part of 2 days getting this new fence in place. Since this is a field we haven't used in a while, it wasn't set up with our new fencing methodology. Fencing methodology...think we've been doing this for a while?

For those of you who have been following us over the past few years, you are quite familiar with our deer struggles. We have invested thousands of hours and dollars trying to keep deer out of our fields. It does feel like we are having a bit more success as of late -- probably because we are electrifying the fence more -- and more consistently.



Once the fence is done, we can plant our 2,100 beautiful sweet potato slips in this great soil. They get to share space with okra as well! Getting hungry just writing about this!



And just like that, the planting has begun! Getting these babies in the ground this morning!



Field Notes

Sweet potatoes and fencing aren't the only things on our minds around here. The new round of cucumbers is planted in the Pavillion and is ready to be trellised. This is a new location for the cucumbers, and we hope that it will have better air circulation than inside the greenhouse. Better air flow will hopefully give the cukes less pest pressure (less stressed plants = less pests). Our two previous rounds of cukes this spring were beset by pests and disease from the get-go.





Pole beans, sweet peppers and lettuce all got planted this week, while we harvested lots of the spring brassicas and carrots. And we are also looking at the garlic and thinking that it is going to need to come out of the ground soon. We are approaching that magic number of 5-6 good leaves left on the plant -- that's when you need to get your garlic out of the ground.

The Joan J Raspberries also got a good weeding -- they had gotten pretty furry! Since it is a new planting (2022), the beds need to be kept relatively weed-free so the plant can get better established and spread.



The plants seemed to be much happier after they got cleaned up! Although I don't think this was instantaneous fruiting!



Speaking of raspberries, thanks so much to all the folks that came out for our Pick Your Own last Saturday! We had a great turnout, and it was nice to see folks head home with berries. Stay tuned for a blackberry PYO announcement in the next few weeks!


