## **Fascinating Fasciation**

Are you familiar with fasciation? This term describes the phenomenon of plant parts flattening or coalescing to form elongated tissue. This abnormal activity in the growing tip often produces very flattened stems with a fan-like enlargement on the end, also known as "crested."

We'll see this phenomenon from time to time around the farm but this year, it has happened on an eggplant. Instead of the normal single flower producing a single eggplant, this fasciation produced a ribbon of flowers which have now started to form little eggplants! Ain't Mother Nature cool?
