It's time for Fun with Nature!



Have you ever seen a <u>Sun Dog</u>? A sun dog is when there is a mini rainbow on one or both sides of the sun. The sun dog appears at about 22 degrees to the right or the left of the sun. Sun dogs are formed when sunlight passes through a thin veil of ice crystal clouds (usually cirrus or cirrostratus), and the ice acts as a prism, refracting the light. The ring is formed by high cirrus clouds which contain ice crystals. <u>Moon Dogs</u> are also possible especially as the weather gets colder! My Dad always said that the number of stars inside the ring of a moon are how many days it will be before snow. Thanks to Elise for capturing this sun dog for us! Here's another interesting winter observation.



This is <u>needle ice</u>. It forms when the temperature of the soil is above freezing, and the air temperature is below freezing. It is fairly common to see this time of year along banks or other exposed areas of soil.


So many cool things to see -- you just have to look around and observe!
