60s. Welcome to North Carolina weather!




Wednesday morning was definitely one of the coldest days we've had in a while. Shortly after this photo was taken, the "Feels Like" temp dropped to 3.

A lot of the week has been spent on getting ready for the Artic blast. Most of our irrigation lines had been taken care of several weeks ago but there were still a few tasks remaining.

One of the important winter tasks that we had not taken care of was installing the ceiling in the greenhouse. We suspend a couple of pieces of greenhouse plastic on wires that are about 7' off the ground. This plastic keeps a large amount of the heat from rising up into the top of the greenhouse -- where is does no good for the plants -- or people. The only beneficiary is the propane company! Since we track how much propane we use each night, we can easily see the difference. This technique cuts 25-30% off our propane bill!

We've been doing this for several years now and the process has gotten much easier. We used to spend 3+ hours on the task, struggling to get numerous pieces of plastic hung and clipped together. Last year, we decided to use 2 large sheets of new greenhouse plastic instead of lots of used pieces. We reinforced the holes that we use to thread zip-ties through to attach to the greenhouse frame. And most importantly, we labeled the plastic with where it fits on the ceiling (SE corner, etc.) and folded it precisely so it could be unfolded and installed quite easily. It worked! The three of us got the job done in less an hour!







More seeds went into trays this week which means more watering. When we had fewer seed trays in the greenhouse during the past couple of months, watering wasn't nearly as important. Now it is -- especially since we have trays on heat mats.
