First of all, we want to thank you for your support of our Summer Plant Sale! We were feeling the love last weekend -- soooo many plants journeyed from our greenhouse to your homes! And thanks for all of the boxes, trays and recyclable agriculture plastic, too!



We're hoping that the cold snap on Sunday through Tuesday didn't affect your plants. We were trying to warn every one of the impending cold, and we hope we were able to get that message to you.

On Sunday, a great group of folks learned about growing better tomatoes at home. This hardy group braved the damp and chill and heard from Farmer Ray

about our tips and tricks for growing tomatoes. Then they got to check out the tomato plantings in our Demo Garden as well as in two of our high tunnels. Smiles all around and a buzz about all the tomatoes in their future!



With one plant sale in the rear-view mirror, it was time to focus our attention on getting potatoes in the ground. This year we are planting a bit less than last year -- only 750 pounds.

One of the tasks that takes the longest is cutting potatoes. Last year it took a couple of days to get through them. This year, the A-Team jumped to our rescue! Wow! They knocked it out in time for lunch! A HUGE Thank You to Lisa, Amy and Brayden!



Detroit also got in on the potato love.



Now that the potatoes are cut into proper sizes, it's time to get them in the ground. Ray got inspired by some reading to once again try using our old transplanter for the task. This old planter had been sitting by the driveway since the last time it was used in 2013. That experience was pretty dreadful because one of the folks working for us kept throwing the potatoes into the chute instead of dropping them -- that damaged the potatoes so much that we had a pretty pathetic crop.

By talking with Cheryl's cousin, Blaine, Ray learned that you could actually use the plant holders (clamps) on the chain. There are specialized potato "cups" you can buy but Blaine said that the plant holder would work just fine.

After figuring and adjusting -- and figuring and adjusting some more, Ray got the equipment set up and ready for <u>a test run</u>. He even cobbled something attached to the planter to bury drip tube while we plant. Looking pretty good, don't you think?



After the planter went about 15 feet, it was time to stop and see how well it was performing. Ray was pleased with the results -- the spacing isn't as tight as

we'd like (12" vs 9") but it will do the job. After a bit more prepping of the field, we'll be a plantin' machine tomorrow! Wish us luck!
