Here's a number for you: 2,403. That's how many plants we sold during the two summer sales. That's a lot of tomatoes, peppers, veggies and herbs!

And even after we sold so many plants, we still had some left over. But fear not! They have gone to good homes! Once again, we donated a truckload of plants to the Forsyth County Cooperative Extension Community Garden

Program. That program supports nearly 120 community gardens throughout the county including school gardens and gardens at public housing. We also donated plants to Threshold Farm in East Bend. Last year, with the help of our

donated plants, the farm provided more than 4,000 pounds of produce to people in need in Yadkin County. From a tiny seed, many good things grow!

Believe it or not, we've been getting other stuff done around here. Jonny, Elise and Ray finished planting all of the potatoes last week. More than a mile of potatoes is now tucked in the ground. Plus, the rains we've had over the past week have been great for getting them all settled!



And the planter did a great job -- all but one bed was planted using it.



Here are a few other things that happened this week....

We are trellising our squash plants for the first time this year. We've been talking about it for several years but finally figured it out and got it done. It's going to be a huge help with our squash crop -- it keeps the



squash off the ground and avoids some of the plant sprawl.



Good progress is being made in South 1. We're having to clear a heavy weed infestation and remove the old landscape fabric. It's a slog but Jonny and Brady are moving through it! We've got to get this field ready for sweet potatoes -- they will be planted at the end of the month.

Elise planted a new round of cucumbers in Mama Meow. We are rotating the plantings between buildings this year. Our first planting was in the greenhouse since it needed a heated environment. Now we can move the crop to an unheated tunnel
