Happy Thursday, Farm Friends!

The rainy, chilly weather this week has had us all looking for a place to nap.



Heavy sigh... only 2 of us have been successful at that!

The rest of us have been trying to dodge the raindrops and get as much work done in the high tunnels as we can. Let's take a look at this week's accomplishments, shall we?



Winter Rye was planted as a cover crop in Flat Shoals field. It finally took off late winter and has formed a pretty good stand of cover.

It's amazing how quickly the cucumber plants have grown! Here is Jonny getting the plants trellised. We're using sisal twine this year as it is compostable and more sustainable.



Ray cultivated the potato fields (with a new-to-us spider weeder!) on Monday. After getting the weeds knocked down, he was able to hill the rows. We're getting some nice growth on the spud seedlings!



Jonny, Brady and Ray harvested the tops of the rye stalks in the drizzle on Tuesday. We'll be using the heads for our garlic braids this year.



Elise, Ray and Jonny have been spending a lot of time getting Lil' Abner weeded and trellised. With this week's last harvest of snap peas and snow peas, we'll be getting our next round of tomatoes planted.



Save the Fields! (and Tunnels)

Jonny and Brady have been on field triage for the past couple of weeks. They've been working hard trying to get the old landscape fabric and drip tape cleared out of South 1 so we can plant sweet potatoes in a couple of weeks.

Today was a major victory! The 7-year old fabric that couldn't be salvaged was taken to the landfill (unfortunately there isn't a way to recycle it) and the remainder was folded and stored. Now we can begin the process of cultivating the field and getting it ready for sweet potatoes and okra!



The second challenge was our high tunnel, Wally. It was an overgrown mess of arugula, celery, lettuce, and radishes. Plus, we had tucked trays of leftovers from the spring plant sale in there as well. Needless to say, it was a rather scary place!



They knocked it out of the park! What a transformation! The tunnel is cleared

and ready for the next crops: celery, frisse, ginger and lettuce.
