Is your mind as boggled as mine? How in the world is it the day before June?! At least we have a new round of summer flowers to enjoy -- and so much more. This daylily was the first of the parade of blooms we'll have this season.

Thanks so much to all of you who reached out to wish me well with the skin cancer. I'm doing well and the incision is healing. I'm just having to deal with a nose that looks like it belongs on a famous Irish American politician! Here's hoping the swelling completely goes away and that the coloration becomes less like a cherry!

Busy week around the farm, for sure. Getting ready to plant sweet potatoes AND making hay are two pretty sizable tasks. Today we'll be sprinting in hopes of crossing the finish line.

For sweet potatoes, the slips arrived this week. We ordered them from <u>Country</u> <u>Farm and Home</u> in Pittsboro as well as from <u>Jones Family Farms</u> in Bailey, NC.

This year we'll be growing only two varieties: NC-122 and Bayou Belle. Last year was our first year for NC-122 (developed at NC State) and we were extremely impressed with it. Bayou Belle has been a favorite for the past few years. We can't wait to share them with you this fall!

Cheryl went to pick up the slips in Pittsboro on Tuesday and she ran into a fellow farmer friend, Natalie Sevin from <u>Sungold Farm!</u> I guess we should have coordinated our pick-ups better! But at least we got to chat over a cup of coffee.



The slips from both sources are beautiful this year! A nice change from what we have received in some years.



The field is prepped and is looking good. The last step in getting these slips in the ground is the fence. Thankfully, it is almost completed -- what a job! The fenced area is comprised of 3 fields -- nearly an acre. The largest field will hold sweet potatoes as well as okra and winter squash. Tomatoes, tomatillos, eggplant, green chile and hot peppers will be in the other two. **So** many t-posts!

There's a lot of time between tiny green grapes and delicious ripe grapes -- as well as time for Japanese Beetles to decimate the crop. But maybe we can catch them in time this year!



That's what we've got for you this week, friends! On our way out, let us tell you about an buzzy astronomical event happening on Monday -- The Parade of Planets. You may have heard that on June 3rd, 6 of the 8 planets in our solar system will be visible in the early morning. Unfortunately, that's just not quite true. NASA states that "in reality, only two of the six planets supposedly on display (Saturn and Mars) will actually be visible. In early June, Jupiter and Mercury will be at or below the horizon in morning twilight and not visible; Uranus and Neptune are far too faint to see without a telescope, especially as the morning sky brightens. The closest thing to a planet parade will be June 29, when Saturn, the Moon, Mars, and Jupiter will line up across the morning sky. This arrangement persists into July." There you have it from the
