Morning Glories! Such wonderful flowers. They are so fragile looking -- this one is almost like a sand dollar glistening with morning dew. I get that some folks call them weeds, but when they are in a place that they can join in with other flowers, they are quite fetching. Appreciate a Morning Glory today!

We've been in pre-storm panic mode around here. Who knows what will happen but lots of rain and some heavy wind seem to be in the cards. Securing things that can blow around and making sure that we've got good drainage around critical areas like the Tobacco Barn have been high on the priority list.

Another priority area is Yam's Barn. We had not cleared out the mud and manure since this spring and it was horrible. It was fine when we were in drought conditions but since we've started getting rain, the muck was intolerable for us and the cows.

Ray was able to get a lot of the area scraped down with the tractor and then Jonny and Celina shoveled out more. This will allow better drainage during downpours and will keep it from getting so mucky for a while.



After the scraping and shoveling, Ray and Jonny put down some landscape fabric and topped it with gravel. Although cows really don't like to walk on gravel, they will probably prefer it to a deep mud pit.



We know this is just a temporary measure, but it will be a huge improvement. We're finally going to have to gulp hard and get concrete in this area. It's getting to be harder to maintain each year.
