These beautiful cosmos have been adding joy to our Anniversary Flower Bed. This is <u>Candyfloss Red</u>, a variety that I found at Baker Creek Heirloom Seeds. It was an impulse purchase, but I'm so glad I did! It's one of the prettiest and most deeply colored cosmos that we've grown.

Whoo-Hoo! Sweet Taters Are In!

Thanks to the hard work and dedication of Team Plum Granny (Jonny and Ray), ALL of the sweet potatoes have now been harvested. Those two miracle workers got the 4 beds of NC-122s out of the field and now they are tucked in the greenhouse staying warm and setting those sugars. Although they weren't as productive as the Bayou Belles that we harvested earlier, we still got over 1,000 pounds!

And Yee-Haw -- Our total yield was 3,569 pounds!!!

Here's some sweet potato trivia. Did you know that North Carolina is the largest producer in the US? According to the USDA, North Carolina harvested nearly 95,000 acres of sweet potatoes in 2016, nearly 30,000 more acres than California, Louisiana and Mississippi combined – also top producing states.

Also, did you know that the correct term is "sweetpotato" not "sweet potato"? The NC Sweetpotato Commission has been engaged in an educational effort to correctly identify this major crop. The one-word spelling was officially adopted by the National Sweetpotato Collaborators in 1989.

The effort stems from the need to ensure that the Sweetpotato (Ipomoea batatas) must not be confused in the minds of shippers, distributors, warehouse workers, and above all consumers with the equally unique and distinctive potato (Solanum tuberosum) or the yam (Dioscorea sp.) which are also grown and marketed commercially in the United States. There's even a petition to support this effort!

Whatever we call them, we know we sure love our tasty orange tubers! And we are SO happy to have them out of the ground!

Don't forget the **Peppers** -- from Sweet to Spicy! We'll have the full line-up of **Green Chile** -- from Medium to Extra Hot along with spicier peppers (Jalapeno, Serrano, Aji Amarillo, Aji Limo, Chinese Five Color and Habanero).
