It's a good thing that he is good at labeling everything in a project like this because he rebuilt the entire wiring assembly for the tractor. No easy task!




The lights now work (1st time for us!) and many more improvements have been made. We'll have a happier J-Cub (and Ray) once we get back in the field soon!
