This week's flower is **Milkweed**. This is <u>Common Milkweed</u> that grows extensively in our area. Ray has been doing a great job maintaining our stands of milkweed and <u>Butterfly Weed</u>. They are very prolific in our hay fields and Ray always mows around them. This year we have a huge milkweed crop in Ruth's Field, where we are growing potatoes. It's going to be fun to look for caterpillars there as we harvest potatoes over the next month or so! Maybe we'll be lucky enough to find a chrysalis to raise! It was such fun when we had the opportunity to do that a few years ago. The thrill of watching an emerging Monarch is incomparable!

Ginger Update

We now have a FULL house of Ginger! Everything got planted and now we'll get all of the plants fed and well irrigated.



As we move into hotter temps, we need to make sure the ginger is well hydrated and not baking in the sun. While ginger is a tropical plant, it is an understory plant - which means that it grows in the shade (at least partial) of larger plants. We try to mimic that natural environment with shade cloth to reduce the intensity of the sun and to cool the foliage with sprayers that mist the plants for a few seconds several times a day. This will be a tropical paradise VERY soon!



Tater Time!

Ray did such a great job of keeping Ruth's Field (our potato field this summer) well-cultivated before his surgery. We couldn't let all that hard work go to waste while we wait a few more weeks for him to be able to drive a tractor again.

He's always been our main tractor guy -- in the words of Chad Tucker in his <u>Roy's Folks</u> <u>segment</u> -- Ray is my "tractor-loving husband." But as he heals after surgery, some of these things must get done. Enter Cheryl.

An equipment agnostic, Cheryl is a bit tractor-phobic. She can drive the Kubota from point A to point B and has even done bush- hogging and hay tedding but cultivation has always been Ray's thing. Until Wednesday.

Cheryl gave it a whirl and started the process of getting the field back under control. It was scary (oh, so scary!) -- because she didn't want to obliterate an entire row of potato plants. But it turned out okay. Ray was very helpful and kind in guiding her through the field and ensuring that no plants were excessively harmed in this process. Success!



Our earliest varieties of potatoes are ready and Jonny got some harvested on Thursday. These delicious spuds will be available at our On-Farm Market on Saturday. And if Cheryl doesn't plow up the field by mistake, we'll have an ongoing harvest over the next few weeks.
