Our coneflowers are quite popular with butterflies and other pollinators. This swallowtail was trapped in the pavilion, so Cheryl scooped it up and set it on a flower for some rest and sustenance. It perched there for several minutes with wings folded but it finally spread its wings to show off its beautiful color. It continued to sit there for several more minutes. These encounters with Nature are so meaningful and precious. It felt like a gift to experience this.

Fall Greenhouse Prep

It's hard to believe but it is time to seed fall crops for our Plant Sale (9/5-9/6)! But before we get started, we needed to clear out all the weeds in the greenhouse and clear out the random dead plants.

It was a mess! Weeds were growing up through the benches and there was a carpet of

green along the sides -- not good. But Jonny and Ray came to the rescue! While Ray sorted the viable from the past-its-prime, Jonny belly-crawled under the benches to evict the weeds. Thank you, Jonny!







Clearing the Tunnel

It's not just the greenhouse getting all spic and span. Jonny also got our high tunnel, Ajo, cleared and prepped for planting a late season crop of cucumbers and squash.

This tunnel was filled with marigolds and volunteer tomatoes (last year's crop is this year's weed). We kept a bed of marigolds to attract beneficials but the rest of it got cleared for seeding. What a transformation!

However, in this process we did learn that marigolds, in large quantities, can cause skin

irritation! There really is a thing known as <u>marigold allergy</u>. Jonny is allergic to several things (primarily stinging insects) but now we know that he is also allergic to marigold plants. Some folks are allergic to marigold pollen and some have contact allergies. Jonny is in the second camp. He developed a stinging sensation on his arms which was alleviated by thorough washing and an antihistamine spray. The best advice is that if you are pulling out weeds -- or marigolds -- wear a long-sleeve shirt to protect your skin.
