
Not everyone wears a cap and gown to his/her final Rehab session, but you know Ray - always the class clown.

There are some spicier options too -- Jalapeno, Serrano and Poblano will be available. Don't forget the **Shishitos** and **Aji Dulce Spice Peppers**. And even though this year's crop of Chile was sad, we will have lots of **Frozen Fire-Roasted Green Chile** that is vacuum packed and ready to go.

And if you don't like peppers -- don't worry! We've got **Sweet Potatoes**! Yes, the potatoes are all "cured", and they are ready to eat. We can vouch for their tastiness -- we tried a couple this week. Yum!



And there's more! Our terrific **Baby Ginger** was a hit last week and we'll have more along with care instructions and lots of yummy recipes.

And, of course, everything we grow is Certified Organic.


